Sales Taxes

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Sales taxes are one of the global types of charges you can set at the catalog level. 20-20 offers the possibility of charging two different taxes. If you need to charge one tax, use the Sales Tax tab only. For Canadians, you will also need to <u>set the Services Tax</u> (<u>GST</u>).

1. Choose Tools, Charges Editor. The Charges Editor dialog appears.

- 3. Click the record to modify, then click **Edit**. The **Edit Sales Tax** dialog appears.

4. Select a field by clicking on it, and then enter the appropriate information by referring to the table below.

Field	Description
Description – Long description	The long form description field. Type in a maximum of 24 characters.
User Code – Short description	Assign a short form description.
Price 1 – Tax Percentage, note: 100.00 = 1%	Assign the tax percentage in this field and remember that the value 100 = 1%
Price 2 – Apply Provincial Tax on the Services Tax (GST) (0 = do not apply, 1 = apply)	For Canadian users only. Type in 0 to prevent the Provincial Tax to be applied on the GST. Type in 1 to apply the Provincial tax on the GST.

- 5. Click **OK** to confirm the changes and return to the previous dialog.
- 5. Repeat the procedure for other records as required.

7. When done, click $\ensuremath{\textbf{Close}}$ to exit the $\ensuremath{\textbf{Charges Editor}}$ dialog.

To make sure all your designs are charged according to your specifications, you must modify the charges in the catalog.
